Blind adventurer Miles Hilton-Barber has, since the age of 50, set numerous world records undertaking extreme events across all seven continents of our world in the fields of mountaineering, desert and polar ultra-marathons, power-boat racing, scuba-diving, motor-racing and long distance, aerobatic and supersonic flying amongst other achievements.

Miles went blind in his early twenties, but has not let that stop him from achieving his dreams. As a popular after-dinner and corporate speaker, Miles weaves together rich anecdotes and humour with powerful life-lessons he has learnt whilst overcoming his blindness. He reminds his

audiences that "attitude is what determines attitude" and that we too can live our dreams.

His recent trips include flying from London to Sydney in a micro-light, climbing Mont Blanc and running across the Gobi Desert.

He has had the privilege of speaking at over 900 corporate events in 71 countries around the world to date.

He is here to remind us that we too can live our dreams, because "the only limits in our lives are those we accept ourselves".



Working shoulder to shoulder at Durrell – The Brick Foundation refresh Dodo Cafe



Our charitable arm of the Jersey Construction Council, (JeCC), have completed an extensive refurbishment of the toilet facilities in Dodo Cafe at Durrell Wildlife Park.

The four week £58,000 project which was delivered to Durrell completely free commenced on the 5th January and was officially opened on the 27th February. It was a collaborative effort from several JeCC member firms who have donated their time, resources and materials heavily discounted or free of charge to give back to the community.

The new facilities will improve the infrastructure of the Park in time for the new tourist season and to help generate much needed funding for their great conservation work. Many premium bookings have been lost in recent years due to a lack of adequate facilities on site, so the upgrade to the Dodo Café will help secure events, conferences and weddings.

Of the many projects we have undertaken, this is the largest scale project we have been involved with and on that the Jersey Construction Council are very proud of.

Awards and Judging General Notes

In this 2015 Awards Toolkit you will find the criteria against which each individual award will be judged. In making a nomination for any award, please consider how this person or project will meet the criteria. This is important for the nominee when we approach them.

All members of the Jersey Construction Council are eligible for nomination in these categories. The following other criteria and judging processes are applicable to these as well:

- The judging period is from 1 April 2014 until 31 March 2015, which is the final date by which a project should be practically completed, with the exception of the JeCC Award of Lifetime Achiever.
- All nominations should be forwarded to the Executive Secretary of the JeCC on an appropriate nomination form for each category. A sample of the nomination form is in this document. Forms can be downloaded from www.jerseyconstruction.org
- Closing date for nominations will be Friday 29 April 2015
- The awards committee will then approach all nominees to verify they wish to go forward in the category and request that they complete our standard submission form.
- These submissions will need to be returned by Friday 12 June 2015 before 5pm to Caroline Harrington, Gemini Cottage, La Rue Du Douet De Rue, St Lawrence, JE3 1GY
- This year the awards judging panel will consist of an independent judging panel comprising of Andy Scate, Executive Officer for the Department of the Environment, Mike King, Chief Executive Officer, Economic Development Department, Professor Ed Sallis retired Principal of Highlands College, Tammy Fage, Director, H&S Inspectorate and Graeme Smith, Chief Executive Officer, Jersey Business.
- A scoring system will be implemented and followed by all judges.
- Please note the only award that will be judged outside this process and qualification time is:
 - o JeCC Lifetime Achiever Award

1) Jersey Electricity - Sustainability Award


Sustainability is commonly defined as “meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs”. - A. Nominations are welcomed from all types of developments and use of products within Jersey’s construction industry that demonstrate a positive attitude toward sustainable construction with a clear focus on environment benefit for the builder/ developer and end user.
- B. Nominees will be asked to clearly demonstrate a desire to reduce the impact the construction has on the environment when designing and planning, not only in the construction process but also the energy consumed by the end user.
- C. Specific areas that are to be considered include:
 - The total energy used
 - Water use and water saving techniques
 - Energy use and energy saving techniques
 - Construction materials
 - Waste management
 - Transportation

- D. The award winner will have clearly demonstrated a clear and measurable gain focusing on the long-term benefits to the environment.

The award is not restricted to new buildings and the Judging Panel will consider renovation and improvements in existing buildings that clearly demonstrate a benefit to the environment.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Award and certificate.



2) Ogier Health & Safety Award

- A. Construction work gives rise to many health and safety challenges for both employers and employees, who are often seeking to improve standards to reduce the risk of injury or ill health occurring.
- B. Entries are welcomed from all sectors of Jersey's construction industry and can cover a range of initiatives such as:-
- Solutions to an identified health or safety issue
 - A workplace scheme to improve health or safety standards
 - A strategy for the reduction and management of injuries or ill health
 - An individual contribution to workplace health and safety
 - Training initiatives
 - Raising external awareness of the potential dangers of construction related activities
- C. Submissions for this Award should show a clear and measurable improvement in health and safety, a positive attitude and a determination to provide a safer working environment either as an organisation or on an individual basis.
- D. Attention will be paid to the means used to measure performance and quantify success, such as key performance indicators and statistical data.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Award and certificate.

3) Skills Jersey Star of the Future

The future of the construction industry in Jersey is dependent on the development of new talented individuals in today's businesses. Therefore, the JeCC is again seeking to highlight and recognise those whose efforts and abilities exceed expectations; encouraging them to go onto greater achievements in their construction careers.

We welcome nominations for candidates who are:

In the early stages of their careers (E.g. a trainee, student, apprentice or someone new to the construction industry and reskilling)


Submissions will cover the following judging criteria:

4) Hepburns Insurance Industry Achiever of the Year

Submissions can come from any area of the construction industry, including but not exclusively from trades, professional organisations, supply chain business and/or individuals.

We welcome nominations in this category for individuals that:

- A. Have the attributes of a leader with ability to motivate and focus others around them on the challenges and goals faced by the team.
- B. Have a proven track record of achievement in his/her field of expertise within the specified period.
- C. Are bright, innovative and forward- thinking individuals at all levels of the management chain.
- D. Can demonstrate a "can do, will do" approach.
- E. The nominee will be asked to provide an organisation chart to show the judging panel the level of management that they are currently at.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Award and certificate.

5) Rossborough Sub Contractor / Supplier of the Year

Suppliers and sub-contractors make up a significant part of any project. Their contribution to the success of projects must not be overlooked. The JeCC wish to acknowledge this important contribution at our Annual Award Dinner.

We are inviting nominations from main contractors, clients and indeed self-nominations. The suppliers and sub-contractors should not shy away from putting forward submissions for this award.


We therefore welcome nominations in this category for businesses that:

6) Comprop Business of the Year

For this award, quality of business is what the judges will be looking for, and we will be welcoming nominations for businesses that fulfil the following criteria:

- A. Demonstration of commitment to the long-term future of the industry, the community and their clients. High standards of work should be highlighted across a range of products or projects under varying conditions.
- B. An understanding and appreciation for the welfare and development of their staff, and a sensible approach to managing risk in their business.
- C. Demonstration of good use of the local construction industry, with a sound understanding of your obligations and your clients' requirements, and of the challenges faced by a particular project or situation.
- D. Forward thinking and an innovative approach to problem solving will enhance the score of a submission.
- E. Prominent in submissions will be details of health and safety, training and development together with a sound business plan and an overall achievement of excellence in your field.
- F. A requirement of this category will be the nomination of a sub-contractor or supplier whom the business worked with during the period from 1 April 2014 until 31 March 2015. A one-page submission will be required indicating the reasons for this nomination

By winning this category, you will have proved yourself to be not necessarily the biggest or most prominent business within the industry, but the best.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Awards and a certificate.


7) Insurance Corporation Consultant of the Year

In order to recognise those working within this sphere of the industry, nominations are invited from consultancy businesses that fulfil the following criteria:

- A. Demonstrate a commitment to the long- term future of the industry, the community and their clients.
- B. High standards of work should be highlighted across a range of projects under varying conditions.
- C. Show an understanding and appreciation for the welfare and development of their staff and a well-structured business plan for future business continuity or growth.
- D. Demonstration of a good knowledge of the local construction industry, with a sound understanding of obligations and Clients' requirements and the challenges presented by a particular project or situation.
- E. Forward thinking and an innovative approach to problem solving and teamwork will enhance the score of a submission.

By winning this category, a consultancy company will have proved itself to be not necessarily the biggest or most prominent consultant within the industry, but the best.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey construction Award and a certificate.



8) Ronez Building Regeneration of the Year Award

Applications will be considered from any regeneration project that was completed during the period from 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2015.

A requirement of this category will be the nomination of a sub-contractor or supplier who has worked on this project nominated for a 2015 award or any other project. A one page submission will be required indicating the reasons for this nomination.

Nominations can be made by anyone involved in the project, whether they are client, consultant, contractor, sub-contractor or supplier – but this must be with the client's prior express permission. This award is not about design alone.

We welcome nominations in this category for projects that meet the following criteria:

- A. Entrants should clearly demonstrate the reasons why the project was regenerated and the value that it has provided to its location and the surrounding environment.
- B. The submission should clearly identify the use of original and sustainable materials sourced from the local supply chain.

- C. Examples of innovative design and building methods should be displayed to demonstrate how the regeneration of an existing building may meet the requirements of the modern day demands of efficiency and sustainability.

- D. Details of all stakeholders should be submitted and an explanation of how the project was achieved through the teamwork involved.

- E. Details of how the health and safety requirements were achieved on the project without compromising the integrity of the regeneration, should form part of the submission.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Award and certificate.

9) JeCC Project of the Year Up to £1 million

Applications will be considered from any category or type of construction project that was completed during the period from 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2015, with the total cost of the project not exceeding £1 million.

The project may be any type of construction project, new build, landscaping, renovation or refurbishment.

A requirement of this category will be the nomination of a sub-contractor or supplier who has worked on this project nominated for a 2014 award or any other project. A one-page submission will be required indicating the reasons for this nomination.



A requirement of this category will be the nomination of a sub-contractor or supplier who has worked on this project nominated for a 2015 award or any other project. A one-page submission will be required indicating the reasons for this nomination.

Nominations can be made by anyone involved in the project, whether they are client, consultant, contractor, sub-contractor or supplier – but this must be with the client's prior express permission. This award is not about design alone.

We welcome nominations in this category for projects that meet the following criteria:

A. Recognition and demonstration of team effort. Illustrating the team working through the supply chain and sub-contractors. The winner will have demonstrated team working from parties such as the client, consultants, contractors, sub-contractors or suppliers.

B. Nominations must include information on the type of procurement used, the completed value of the project, and the project timescale.

C. Prominent in submissions will be details of health and safety and an overall achievement of excellence in the relevant field.

D. Demonstrate the procurement of local resources through the supply chain and professional services.

E. Demonstrate quality control procedures for the project.

F. Demonstrate the environmental considerations and achievements for the project.

The award winner will receive a 2015 Jersey Construction Award and certificate.

11) JeCC Lifetime Achiever Award

This prestigious and popular award continues in its current format.


All members of JeCC are invited to make nominations.
